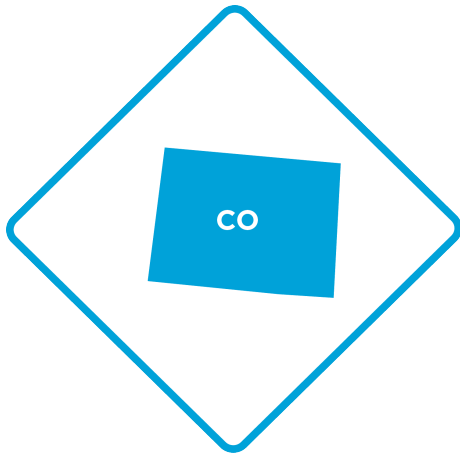


NIH FUNDING AT WORK IN COLORADO

QUICK FACTS

NIH awarded **\$567 MILLION**¹ in grants and contracts during FY2024 that directly supported **6,951 JOBS**² and **\$1.59 BILLION**² economic activity in Colorado.
