QUICK FACTS

NIH awarded **\$738.4 MILLION**¹ in grants and contracts during FY2020 that directly supported **17,146 JOBS**² and **\$2.397 BILLION**² economic activity in Florida.

The highest annual occurrences of disease deaths in Florida are due to **CANCER** (45,281 lives lost), **HEART DISEASE** (47,027 lives lost) and **STROKE** (13,255 lives lost).³
